WHAT WE DO


- Spread prevention/early detection






WHAT WE DO

ON THE HORIZON

- Development of regional resources for replanting treatment areas
 - BMPs and plant lists for various habitats
 - Directory of nurseries and contractors
- Regional collaborative on woody ornamental invasives (tent.)







NEW INVASIVE - FICARIA VERNA

- ► Thrives in disturbed areas ditches & streambanks
- Very early spring ephemeral
 - Forms dense carpets & prevents the germination of native wildflowers
- ► Reproduces by seed & tubers







NEW INVASIVE - MICROSTEGIUM VIMINEUM


- Thrives in disturbed areas ditches & streambanks
- Forms dense carpets & prevents the germination of both spring and late season natives
 - Has allelopathic potential
- Reproduces by seed
- Deer won't eat it





NEW INVASIVE - EUONYMUS ALATUS

- Popular ornamental
 - ❖Pruning → ++ reproduction
- Invader of both IL oakhickory-maple forests & prairie
- ► Hardy, long season
- Seed spread by birds
- Deer won't eat it




NEW INVASIVE - EICHHORNIA CRASSIPES

- ► Fascinating introduction/early control story
- Forms dense mats, excluding natives & depleting water O₂
- Excellent mosquito breeding habitat
- Cold winters prevent naturalization...
 - Spread readily by boat traffic, water garden escape

- 26 35 species
