

- Saturday in June
- Open house style
- Visit stations at your own pace
- Kids get a passport book
- Kids earn a Junior Naturalist badge
- Family oriented with more adults than children attending
- 10-13 Learning Stations
- Station hosts: NLI Education Committee members and community partner organizations
- Funded by grants and sponsors

2020 Transition to Virtual

- Marketing Agency helped to rebrand the virtual event
 - New name and graphics
 - Promotional plan
- > Same concept with learning stations
 - Asked past learning station hosts to help: video and activity
 - Professional videographer to master videos for consistency and to add intro and outro branded slides
- Videos paired with suggested activities to do in backyard or park
 - Questions to answer after doing activity
 - Answers anonymous and compiled into report

More Key Messages

Watch a video, do the suggested activity, answer questions.

Family Nature Adventures is an opportunity to connect and engage with nature through a series of 13 free guided activities

Participate in this ongoing summer program with your family or on your own!

The learning videos included a variety of nature themed topics: wetlands, fish, water, mammals, birds, archaeology, pollinators, butterflies, creepy crawlers, prairies, forests, seeds and soils.

- You can do this anywhere. Since these activities are posted online, there is no specific geographic boundary
- No cost or registration to participate.
 - Final Participation Form fill out and submit after doing at least six activities to receive the Junior Naturalist badge

- Anyone can participate at their own pace
- Completing the videos and form to earn your badge is based on the honor system

- Video releases will be announced over NLI's email, social media
- Weekly on Wednesday, June 10 July 1 (4 weeks)
 - 3-4 videos loaded on Website Tuesday night each week
 - Videos grouped in themes
- After week four periodic emails were sent out until Sep. 7
- Drawings for Prizes
 - Grand, Second, Third
 - Provided additional incentive to watch videos/do activities
 - Required submission of the Final Participation Form
 - Drawings held after last day of event
- Bonus Online Coloring book by local artist
 - Downloadable
 - Nine animals in their habitat with descriptions

Tracked Participants

14 videos (2 with Backyard Birds)

Videos views: estimated more than 1,100

Answers to suggested activities were anonymous – compiled answers



One Answer - Funny story:

Millipedes, crickets, ants, earthworms, miniature bivalves, others that were too quick for us to identify. Then we were followed by a couple of raccoons and decided we better leave.



Pollinators

- > Final Participation Form
- Junior Naturalist badges and certificates presented: 14
- What videos watched top2: Pollinators and CreepyCrawlers
- Demographics
 - Locations: From as far away as California, central IL, Rock Co, WI; and mostly Winnebago County
 - Age, race, gender: mostly white males under age 11

- Other questions asked:
 - What was favorite video/activity and why
 - Invited to tell us something else about their experiences

Example: It gave us a focused way to engage with the outdoors beyond what we already did on a regular basis. We'll likely complete all the activities eventually because we had so much fun!






Challenges

- Getting people to share photos on social media of children doing the activities


Positive Outcomes

- Example: The mother of the grand prize winner said the soils video really made an impression on them because when they went kayaking they noticed erosion on the bank of the river.
- Engaging families and children in nature in a structured way.
- Reaching beyond the traditional limits of a geographical boundary.
- Reaching people who can't or don't want to visit a preserve.
- Creating more awareness in the community for NLI
- Letting our members and the community know that NLI is adapting to challenges created by a pandemic and that we are a flexible organization.
