Re: VSN Stewardship Fund – FY22 (July 2021 – June 2022)

Each year, The Nature Conservancy dedicates funds to support the work of volunteer groups by providing stewardship tools and safety equipment and by funding newsletters, websites, and educational materials. Organizations requesting funds for their native habitats are required to complete the attached application and submit it (along with a map of their natural areas*) by **Friday, June 25, 2021**. *If you applied for funding in the past and your natural areas have not changed, you do NOT need to include a map with your application.

VSN Background

Across the state, thousands of volunteers from all walks of life regularly roll up their sleeves to help clear out invasive species, collect and sow native plant seeds, assist with prescribed fire and monitor populations of indigenous plants and animals. These individuals are part of the Volunteer Stewardship Network (VSN), a loose network of volunteers affiliated with public and private organizations helping to bring health back to our native lands and waters and our communities. The VSN is currently comprised of over 125 groups across Illinois.

The VSN was formed in 1983 by The Nature Conservancy and the Illinois Nature Preserves Commission. Through this partnership, we continue to provide leadership and support for the Volunteer Stewardship Network with a goal to support, promote and expand the role of volunteers working to protect and manage natural areas in Illinois.

Requests will be evaluated based on the following criteria:

- Activity level of the VSN group
- Need could the request be satisfied by the landowner or another funding source?
- Urgency is something in imminent danger of being lost?
- Benefit to the natural resource
- Benefit to the community
- Does it leverage other resources and funding?
- How well it fits in with the spirit of the VSN
- Items requested clearly match the needs of the organization

As you identify your needs, please keep in mind the funds awarded in 2021 MUST be spent and receipts received by June 1, 2022.

You will be notified in July if your funding request has been approved. If approved, you will receive a letter indicating the amount of funds available to your group. It is important to note that the money is not a grant, e.g. you will not receive the money in advance. Either you will be reimbursed in a timely way for expenses approved through this process or tools and supplies will be ordered and shipped through The Nature Conservancy.

Please note: The VSN is also providing support to VSN groups through the **Community Convening Fund (CCF)**. The goals of the CCF are to support people and nature by:

- funding projects that foster community connections to nature;
- meaningfully engage BIPOC (black, indigenous, people of color) and other historically underrepresented communities in the programming, care and protection of greenspace;
- providing co-benefits for human and environmental health.

If your group is working in or with BIPOC communities and is in need of funding for trainings, expertise sharing, conferences/meetings, cultural and community building events, travel and transportation, or community development/research, please contact Brooke Thurau at brooke.thurau@tnc.org to request an application. VSN groups must complete a separate VSN Community Convening Fund application by **Friday**, **June 25**, **2021**. ***Groups may apply for both funds**.

Award decisions will be made in July and notification will come shortly after.
