

Day 1 (Full day in the classroom, Lake Forest, IL-limited to 35 people)

Planning, design, and maintenance of universally accessible pedestrian trails. Topics will include: the fundamentals of universal design, universal access trail planning & management; introduction to the 2013 Outdoor Developed Areas Accessibility Guidelines (ODAAG); small group work on universal access trails for your own setting(s).

Start to finish: creating & managing your own universal trail project. Participants should bring a project idea or concept, for your own universally accessible trail project, to this session. Working with Larry, and in small groups, you will gain experience needed to begin planning your own project for a universally accessible trail that is practicable for your own site. This day will include a visit to an active Lake Forest Open Lands site in Lake Forest. Please wear weather appropriate clothing and footwear for Day 2.
